

The Right ree in the Right Place

You can help reduce right-of-way maintenance costs by selecting trees for your yard based on their mature height and proximity to electric lines.

- Plant tall trees well away from overhead lines, and make sure the roots will have room to grow and won't interfere with underground lines.
- Plant small trees near any power lines.
- Make sure there are no underground power lines where you plan to dig. To check, call Pennsylvania One Call at 811 or 1-800-242-1776.
- Trees planted too close to electric lines must be trimmed. Your cooperation is appreciated when your trees require pruning.
